WHY WE ARE MARCHING ON OCTOBER 26: \$200 BILLION FOR JOBS AND EDUCATION Not for War in Iraq!

Poverty in the United States is soaring. The real unemployment rate is higher than anytime in the last thirty years. In New York City alone, more than 1.5 million people depend on charity from food pantries to feed their families. This is the real crisis that is undermining the security of tens of millions of people. So why is Bush planning to spend \$200 billion (a conservative figure) for a war and occupation of Iraq?

Iraq poses no military threat to the people of the United States. Don't believe the war propaganda that seeks to portray Iraq as a great nuclear menace. Iraq has never possessed a nuclear weapon. The U.S. government, on the other hand, has 6,000 nuclear weapons and has spent a total of \$6 trillion building this stockpile of weapons. The U.S. military budget is already more than the next closest 15 countries combined, and the Pentagon stands to get its biggest budget increase in 20 years.

Iraq is a country weakened by twelve years of U.S. bombing and sanctions. It is Iraq who has been the victim of U.S. aggression. The U.S.-led UN sanctions on Iraq have killed over 1.5 million people (according to the UN Food and Agricultural Organization). Sanctions have been proven to be the true weapon of mass destruction.

Now, the Bush administration wants to "finish the job" they started in Iraq in 1991. They are not planning to wage war to install a democratic government in Iraq. They are calling on young people to kill and be killed in order to install a puppet government that will be run by Corporate America.

On Saturday, October 26, 2002 -- the first anniversary of the signing of the so-called Patriot Act -- hundreds of thousands of people from anti-war, civil rights, labor, student and other organizations will be marching to tell Bush that we need money for jobs, education, healthcare, childcare and housing - not for a war that will only benefit ExxonMobil, Citibank and his friends in Corporate America. Mass marches and rallies will be held in Washington DC and San Francisco in the U.S., and in many other countries.
